ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE

Ski-Tow Mfg. Co. says its new "Stalker" all-terrain vehicle is capable of hitting 30 miles an hour over ground, climbing hills at crazy angles, fording rivers and swimming

lakes.

The Stalker is built with a rugged molded body of ABS plastic. The machine is powered by a 12 horsepower Tecumseh (3800 rpm) 4-cycle, air cooled engine with either manual or electric start.

The six chain-driven low-pressure balloon tires distributes the weight of the vesicle evenly over a large area so that the Stalker is as much at home in water and mud as it is on land. Top speed is up to 30 MPH on land and two to four miles per hour in the water.—Ski-Tow Mfg. Co.

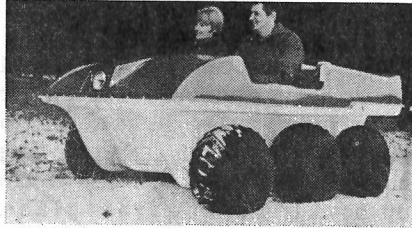

Six-Wheel Vehicle Goes Anywhere

An all-terrain vehicle engineered to hit 30 mph over ground, the Stalker climbs hills at crazy angles, traverses sand or snow, fords rivers and swims lakes. It is rated at two to four mph on water.

Built with a rugged molded ABS plastic body, the Stalker is power-

ed by a 12 hp. Tecumseh four-cycle, air cooled engine with manual or electric start.

Six chain-driven low-pressure balloon tires distribute the vehicle's weight over a large area, facilitating travel in water and mud.
